Sermon Discussion Guide

October 2, 2022

READ

Read 1 Samuel 25 aloud and consider making some observations about the passage.

Sermon Recap: Review the sermon with your group, highlighting the following:

- God will fight our battles for him if we will just leave things in God's hands. We don't need to take vengeance; God will do it.
- You cannot accomplish the promise of the Spirit in the power of the flesh.
- The scroll of Samuel has already begun to stir our affections for a King more righteous than even David.
- Jesus didn't change us by paying us back for our sin; he changed us by showing us grace (see Group Discussion question below).

GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. When was the last time you lost your temper? What did you learn from it?
- 2. Read James 1:19–27. What do verses 19–21 teach us in their context?
- 3. Why is it important for us to have wise counsel in addition to prayer? Has anyone in our small group or church given you godly wisdom to help you make a difficult decision? How can you cultivate a lifestyle of seeking godly wisdom from others?
- 4. How do these stories in 1 Samuel point us to Jesus? What makes Jesus so much better than David?
